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Uniform Philosophy

Establishing a school uniform is driven by the desire to promote an environment of learning where dress is not a distraction to the educational process, based upon the following principles:

1. Our goal is to honor God in all we do, acknowledging the Lordship of Jesus Christ in our choices.
2. All human actions, including outward manifestations such as clothing, communicate the disposition of the heart. It is our desire to address these heart issues in one uniform dress policy, rather than seeking to anticipate and curb its numerous manifestations throughout the year that surface with a looser dress code. In line with this, students are to remain in their school uniforms while they are under the supervision of FBCA staff.
3. Clothing represents the vocational calling of a person, and inherent in the uniform dress code is a desire to create an environment where no undue attention is drawn to specific students. The neat appearance created by a uniformly dressed student body enhances a ready-to-learn atmosphere.
4. Uniformity helps engender a cohesive presentation of the students in our school. When our students are uniformly dressed, it aesthetically communicates that they are part of the same team, working toward the same goals. The student is part of a group identity that strives for excellence, and the code establishes a tradition toward that end.
5. Neither parents nor students will experience the temptation to constantly be adding to their wardrobe throughout the year in order to meet constantly shifting cultural standards. The uniform dress code de-emphasizes the social impact of dress and helps focus the students on character and academic issues.
6. Most importantly, the uniform dress code addresses **security**. On field trips, students who are dressed similarly aid the teachers in keeping track of everyone. On the playground or in the school, especially within a downtown setting, teachers and staff can clearly identify students from outsiders.

Students are expected to comply with the uniform policy while at the school unless specified otherwise by the administration. The administration is responsible for the interpretation of the policy. The enforcement of the policy is the responsibility of parents, administration, faculty, and staff.

Labeling of Items

Due to the number of similar items, we ask that each be labeled with the student's name.

If you are interested in purchasing labels, FBCA is registered with Mable's Labels, which provides high-quality custom labels which are washing machine and dishwasher safe. This also serves as a fundraiser for the Academy. Visit mabelslabels.com, select "Support a Fundraiser" and search for "First Baptist Classical Academy."

Uniform Basics

The Uniform Charts list what is required and what is optional for each gender and grade. Each Friday, and other designated special occasions as announced, are considered a “Formal Day,” requiring the Formal Uniform. All other days are “Non-Formal” and have a wider selection of options.

Select formal items are recommended to be purchased in the brand French Toast (abbreviated in chart as F.T.) for quality purposes.

The school will not be doing a bulk order directly from French Toast. All French Toast uniform pieces can be purchased on Amazon.ca and you will find this to be a cheaper option. If you wish to order directly from French Toast, be sure to change the shipping flag to Canada, so that all prices are set to Canadian dollars. Duties and taxes are calculated at the checkout and include landed costs (no additional charges at delivery). As French Toast is located in the US, orders may take quite a while to come in therefore, it is best to order early in the summer for the following school year.

Garments that require the school crest can have the crest embroidered by the school at the cost of \$7.00 per item. Please contact Elysha Patterson our school secretary to have your embroidery completed. Please note that she requires a one-week turn around for all embroidery jobs.

For items not specifically designated in the Uniform Charts as French Toast, feel free to shop other stores as is most convenient and economical for your family. Please shop from the “school uniform” sections, not general merchandise, to ensure modesty and quality. Walmart, Old Navy, and Children’s Place all offer uniform options for these supplemental items.

Selected crested items are kept on hand at the school; please inquire with our secretary, Elysha Patterson as to the items available. Parents are encouraged to sell or exchange non-crested items among themselves. Any additional questions regarding the school uniforms can be directed to the Secretary or Headmaster.

The medium blue tie for our logic and rhetoric students can be purchased locally at McAllister & Howard in downtown Kamloops. When you arrive at the store, you can ask an associate for a medium blue (color F), Lugano brand tie. This is a men’s tie that should be worn tied in a Windsor knot.

Clarifications and Additional Notes

1. Tuesdays are always Formal Days. The rest of the weekdays will be considered “non-formal”. Other than Tuesdays, the scheduling of formal days will be clearly communicated in advance.
2. All field trips will require a Formal Uniform, however, on occasion, the non-formal uniform will be allowed, so long as a school crest is present and visible.
3. Non-crested Cardigans may be worn with formal uniform.
4. All shorts, jumpers, and skirts **must** be knee-length. This means they must reach the line at the back of the knee. Uniforms will be considered out of dress code when they are above the kneecap in order to allow time to purchase a new size when a child grows.
5. The top shirt button needs to be buttoned when ties are worn otherwise, the top button can be left unbuttoned.
6. Other than Logic & Rhetoric Ladies, all shirts must be worn tucked in.
7. Other than Logic & Rhetoric Ladies, all pants and shorts must be worn with a belt.
8. Students should not come to school with torn clothing. Particularly on formal uniform day, your child’s clothing needs to be well-fitting (no “high-waters”).
9. Grade 6&7 students **only**, have the option to choose between wearing the grammar or logic uniform.
10. Although not listed in the clothing chart, navy blue blazers are acceptable to wear at any age level. They are not required, these are only optional.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Q. Must I order all uniform items through French Toast?
A. Only the items designated with F.T. are required to be French Toast brand and can be ordered from their website or Amazon. All other items may be purchased from the place of your choosing.
2. Q. What is the difference between an athletic shoe and a casual sneaker (ie. Converse)?
A. An athletic shoe is designed to be worn for sports, exercise or recreational activity and offers cushioning, flexibility, stability and traction and are able to be laced up for a snug fit. Casual sneakers are not athletic shoes due to their simple flat rubber sole lacking in support and cushioning.
3. Q. Are camisoles or undershirts acceptable?
A. Camisoles, bras, undershirts and kick shorts are considered undergarments. All undergarments should be worn as needed and must be out of sight at all times.
4. Q. Are leggings acceptable?
A. Leggings are **NOT** acceptable. Only footed tights, or knee-high socks are acceptable for girls. Logic & Rhetoric ladies may also wear nylons.
5. Q. What is the school’s approach to makeup and hair dye?
A. God has created each of us unique. Make-up and hair dye can be used to accent that natural beauty but should not be used to cover it up or cause a person to be the focus of others attention. Therefore, if make-up is worn at FBCA it should be subtle and not bright in nature. Hair dye is limited to natural colors.
